**1937**

**1936 – 1937 Founder President Rotarian John Salmon**

As a tangible expression of his thanks to members for their loyalty he presented the Club with a luncheon gong.

**1937 – 1938 President – Rotarian Wilfred Henson**

President Wilfred presented a carved oak speaker's desk to the Club. The desk was surrounded by the Rotary Wheel and had an engraved silver plate attached to the front giving particulars of the presentation.

**1946 – 1947 President – Rotarian W. C. Speedy**

Rotarian R. Henderson presented an Attendance Board to the Club for use with the Rotary Wheel attendance sheets.

**1943 – 1944 President – Rotarian P. Wardle**

To mark his year of office, the new President presented the Club with a light for the reading desk, and Past President Richard Payne gave the Club a new Charity Collection Box bearing a suitably inscribed brass tablet to mark his thanks for support during his year of office

**1947 – 1948 President – Rotarian S. C. A. Webb**

In February, 1948 an order was placed for a Rotary Plaque to go outside Stanton's Cafe.

**1954 – 1955 President – Rotarian J. P. Howarth**

Rotarians F Linford and R Hawkins provided, free of cost, a handsome Past Presidents Board for Club Headquarters



1960 – 1961 President – Rotarian Harold W. Corns

A Call Bell was presented by Rotarians George and Bert Taylor. It was recommended that the Past President's Jewel belonging to the late Founder President John Salmon be made into a badge of office for the Senior Vice President.

1961 – 1962 President – Rotarian George A. Jervis

A large Deed Box costing £5:15:6d was purchased in December and all Club records were put in it. It was then placed in safe custody at Lloyds Bank in Cannock.

(In 1985 these records were transferred to the Local History Library in Cannock, and the box was allocated to the Secretary for his use).

1965 – 1966 President – Rotarian C. G. Beddow

Rotarian Brian Harper presented the Club with a new reading desk made to the design of Rotarian Frank Roberts.

1972 – 1973 President – Rotarian James T. Dowding

The Club lost another of its founder members early in 1973 when Richard Payne died on his 84th birthday.

He was President from 1947-48 and for 28 years was Principal of the Technical College in Cannock.

His family offered the gold medallion which Richard had been given as a Past President to the Club to convert into a badge of office for the Junior Vice President, and Roger Dolphin was presented with this jewel in September 1973.
