



3 Rotary Clubs Tripartite History



TRIPARTITE – made between or involving three parties or groups

Rotary Club of Cannock chartered 1935

Rotary Club of Brie Compté Robert chartered 1965, merged with another Rotary Club in 2005 and renamed Brie Pontault.

Rotary Club of Badmunster Nehatal chartered 1972, Club renamed Bad Kreuznach Nahetal in 1990

September 1970	First contact made with Brie when a party of Cannock Rotarians and their wives visited France
May 1975	First visit to Cannock by 10 Brie Rotarians and their wives
January 1976	Brie celebrated their 10 th Anniversary and first contact was made with Badmunster
April 1976	Official twinning between Cannock and Brie signed in France and recognised by RIBI
April 1980	First visit to Badmunster by Cannock Rotarians and a formal proposal made for a three way link.
April 1982	The 3 way link was officially recognised during a meeting held in Cannock with representation from all three clubs.

Since that date annual meetings have been held in each Country on a rotation basis and the clubs have donated to each others' selected projects and, on occasion, have embarked on joint ventures.

Recent initiatives include financial support to train nurses in Attat hospital in Germany; physical and financial support for Therapies Unite in Mexico, sponsored by RC Cannock; financial support for the Alzheimer 77 project in France.

Numerous exchanges of Rotarians' children have taken place for holidays and work experience.

Our visit to Stratford-upon-Avon will mark the 40th anniversary of the 3 way link between our Rotary Clubs.
